

Queries & Clarifications:

We have recently received queries from teams, who have sought a clarification on the Moot Problem as under:

- Q1. Moot Problem states refer to common law principles. Kindly inform as to the references to common law. (EXAMPLES)
- A1. Please refer to the moot problem and related textbooks/commentaries/ legal resource material for the common law principles referred to in the moot problem.
- Q2. With regard to the sentence awarded, the statute allows for a minimum of 10 years. Awarded sentence is 9 years. Is this an issue?
- A2. Please respond to the Moot Problem as it stands. No clarification is necessary.
- Q3. Firstly, are the facts silent and whether we can assume? Secondly, whether the police, while arresting Dr. Ibrahimovic, were without a warrant? Thirdly, whether Dr. Ibrahimovic after his arrest, which was on 21st Jan 2012, brought to court directly on the day of his trial, i.e. on 9th Feb, and not before that?
- A3. Where the facts are silent, necessary and rational assumptions may be made. No clarifications are necessary to other queries. Students are expected to rely upon the Moot Problem.
- Q4. 1) Where ever the facts are silent what should be our standard approach?
2) The new judge began hearing the case on 23rd February 2012 and he started hearing the counsel for accused and now in the middle of hearing he felt violently ill for 15 days and resumed proceedings by 15th March 2012. So, its creating a confusion as to whether the accused was given fair trial by the judge as he further reserves the judgment for 2 more weeks and ultimately delivers the verdict on 29th March 2012 but no where being mentioned about the complete hearing on the contempt application ?
- A4. Where the facts are silent, please rely on the moot problem. Necessary and rational assumptions may be made.
- Q5. 1) Whether Marijuana is a controlled substance in Polkraine and whether possession of the same is an indictable offence?
2) Was a warrant issued to the law enforcement agencies when they carried out the search and seizure procedure at the premises of the petitioner?
- A5. There are no clarifications necessary for these questions. Students are expected to rely upon the problem.

- Q6. Are contempt proceedings in Polkaine tried summarily?
- A6. No clarification is necessary. Students are expected to rely upon the Problem.
- Q7. 1) What all are the basic requirements for our research work?
2) What kind of judgments would you prefer in our research work?
3) Can we use American law judgments or English law judgments or both?
